## **VISA APPLICATION CHECKLIST**



The B-I visa is a US visa status that lets visitors enter the United States for businessrelated activities for up to six months. It is a great visa option for people who are planning to do a wide range of permissible business activities in the US, which include: **attending meetings, trainings and conferences; and meetings with advisors, customers, vendors, mentors and colleagues.** 

Below is an easy step-by-step guide for applying for the B-1 visa.

STEP 1 Complete Form <u>DS-160 <sup>[2]</sup></u> online	Plan to spend about 30 minutes filling it out.		
STEP 2 Schedule a visa interview appointment	This is done online for the U.S. Embassy or Consulate 🗹 of your choice. Be prepared to schedule your appointment a few weeks in advance. Check the less-than-totally-reliable wait times 🗹 for a specific Embassy or Consulate.		
STEP 3 Collect supporting documents	Gather required and appointment. Barcode page from Form DS-160 <b>REQUIRED</b> A valid passport photo <b>REQUIRED</b>	d supporting documer MRV fee receipt <b>REQUIRED</b> Accelerator program letter <b>IF APPLICABLE</b>	nts to bring with you to your Valid passport. STEP 4 Prepare for your interview	Know which activities you can and cannot do, and be prepared to explain your plans to the staff at the consulate.		
STEP 5 Complete your interview	You'll almost always get an immediate decision and a visa sticker in your passport within a few days.
